to determine who would advance. However, the weather was not cooperative with the two teams as rain suspended the first game and moved around the scheduled start times.

“I believe the weather issue was a benefit of ours,” Lions’ coach Erin Kinberger said. “My kids are tough both mentally and physically; they are mature, and recognize it’s an issue they can ... separate from the game. They do a great job of using the ‘issue’ as a challenge.

“I’m extremely proud and honored to be a part of this program and team, who has worked extremely hard for this opportunity,” Kinberger said.

Game 1 started off in the Chargers’ favor with a three-run home run by junior Jada Hayes but the Lions answered back with a double steal that lead with junior Ashley Morris’s theft of home plate. Freshman Alexis Miniet hit a RBI single up the middle to trim the deficit to 3-2.

The SLU scoring continued in the fifth inning when Miniet hit an RBI groundout to tie the game.

Then the rain came to suspend the contest until the next morning.

Miniet came up as the hero the next day with an RBI single, her third of the game, to center field to give the Lions a 4-3 win and a 1-0 series lead.

Game 2 was an odd sight as Saint Leo was the road team on their own field. The Chargers again started off the scoring with a single to right to

make it 1-0 in the bottom of the first. The Lions evened up the score in the top of the third when junior Ashley Morris hit a RBI double to the left-center gap.

The Lions continued to add runs and by the time the Chargers came up in the 7th inning they were looking at elimination and a 5-2 deficit.

After a bases-loaded walk to make it 5-3, freshman Kiara Akles came up and hit a walkoff grand slam to give the Chargers a 7-5 win and force a Game 3 in heart-breaking fashion.

Because of more bad weather, Game 3 was moved to Saturday and was scoreless through the first two-and-a-half innings, but the scoring started when junior Shyanne DuBois hit a single between the shortstop and third baseman to make it 1-0, and in the fourth, senior Bailey McKenna hit a single up the middle to make it 2-0.

The big blast came in the 5th inning when Bethany Kursch crushed a grand slam beyond left field to open the game at 6-0.

The Chargers would not go down without a fight as Shannon Long hit a three-run homer, her second of the series, to cut the Lions’ lead to 6-4.

But the Lions held on to win the series 2-1 and advance to the NCAA Division II College World Series.

The Lions will again be the underdog in the first game of the College World Series as they will face Chico State (55-4) on Saturday at James I. Moyer Sports Complex in Salem, Va.

Saint Leo University has three teams vying for national titles – including two first-timers, softball and men’s lacrosse.

The Saint Leo men’s lacrosse team is going to Boston for the NCAA Division II Men’s Lacrosse Championship as the South Region representative. The No. 2 seeded Lions upset the No. 1 seed, Lenoir-Rhyne, 12-11, in Hickory, N.C., last Sunday.

Thomas Tatarian earned 16 saves on Bears’ 59 shots.

Kyle Pauwels and Matt Shand led the offense with three points each; both from two goals and one assist. The Green and Gold used 10 different sticks to claim the victory.

The Lions will play Sunday to the NCAA Division II championships at 4 p.m., in Gillette Stadium.


After climbing seven spots at the

South/Southeast Super Regional, Saint Leo men’s golf is competing at the National Championships in Muscle Shoals, Ala., on the par-72, 7,407-yard Fighting Joe course.

Saint Leo sent Riley Goss, Bas Vermeulen, Simon Knutsson, Oliver Lillidahl, and Alberto Castagnara to the links to compete for the 2018 championships.

The tournament will see three days of stroke play where the top eight teams advance to the quarterfinals today. After the first 54-holes, the 2018 Individual national champion will be crowned where the top eight teams will battle for the team title with medal/match play.

Saint Leo won the national golf championship in 2016, making it the first championship in school history for a team.

# Woofstock Succeeds In New Location

Recent rain didn't get in the way of a doggone good time at this year's Woofstock, which welcomed sunny skies and hundreds of happy canines.

The fourth annual event was hosted by Pasco County Animal Services and Friends of Animal Services, Inc. (FPCAS) to raise money for sick and injured dogs and cats at the Pasco County shelter in Land O' Lakes.

"We thought we were going to get rained out today so it's really been wonderful that the weather has cooperated as well as it has," said Darelene Greene, treasurer for FPCAS.

Although a total of funds raised was not calculated by press time, Rachel Stever of PCAS said the turnout was great.

"I'm pretty sure we far surpassed how many we had last year as far as attendance," she said Tuesday. "It went very well."

When money is the only thing preventing an animal from having necessary treatment to make them adoptable, Woofstock comes into play. Half of the money raised will go toward medical funds while the remaining will go into a general account for the shelter, Greene said.

This year's event brought in the normal array of pooches who dressed in their park best to welcome as many belly rubs and treats as they could muster.

Prince, an adoptable dog at the shelter, was stationed at the Tail Wagon mobile adoption vehicle and was as happy as could be. His handler said Prince was receiving treats all morning from admirers.

In addition to county services, independent rescue services were on site including Skyway Dachshund Rescue, Skunk Rescue, English Spring Spaniel Rescue, Forgotten Tails Rescue, Cocker Spaniel Rescue and Lab Rescue. Most had adoptable dogs on site to strut their stuff around the event, which was held this year at Land O' Lakes Heritage Park.

"It's been going wonderful. We've had a great turnout. We've had a lot of people coming out here to support the shelter," Greene said halfway through Saturday's event.

Vendors selling pet supplies and accessories, local pet services and food and snacks were also set up. A vaccine clinic offered discounted vaccines for pet owners, which many were taking advantage of, according to Greene.

Many attendees brought their own lawn chairs to set up shop in the shade and listen to live music performed by local bands Beyond Chaotic, Crossing the Tangent, and Malaya.

The animal shelter in Pasco County is a save-90 percent shelter and tries to save as many animals as possible.

# Sertoma, CARES Making Sure People Listen

## Free Screenings Expand Through New Partnership

On a mission to help Florida residents not miss a beat, the Sertoma Speech and Hearing Foundation of Florida holds free hearing screenings across the state.

Sertoma stopped by the CARES Crescent Center on Monday, following a new partnership with the organization.

Sertoma offers screenings for people of all ages, but mostly focuses on children. However, the partnership with CARES, which focuses on quality care for seniors, will allow Sertoma to expand more on its 55 and older program.

Representatives from Sertoma set up shop in the CARES lobby in Dade City and welcomed anyone and everyone for a free screening.

Sertoma works with Florida Telecommunications Relay to provide free amplified phones to Florida residents with hearing loss. While it was a slow afternoon, they said, they were able to

help some with hearing tests and to look at some phone options.

“It can amplify the sound and they all work with your hearing aids and they have several different tone controls if you have difficulty hearing certain pitches,” said Sertoma Administrative Assistant Ian David. “So, if a woman’s voice, if you have trouble hearing that because it’s higher, you can turn the tone down so you have a better time understanding it and hearing it.”

Assistant Outreach Coordinator Kym Liberty said they do not have a second event scheduled at the Dade City location, but they will most likely have another in the future.

“It’s a community service we’re trying to provide for people and help with funding for hearing aids as well,” Liberty said.

The Sertoma Speech & Hearing Foundation is a part of the Coalition for Spoken Language Options that makes available listening and spoken language




