After seven years of hosting the Raising Cane event around sweet sugar cane stalks, the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village is adding a little spice to this year's homage to homemade syrup - a chili cook-off.

In addition to the usual homemade cane syrup pancake breakfast, syrup tasting contest, and other sugarcentered events, the daylong event will

feature a professional and amateur chili cook-off. The International Chili Society will sanction the professional competition, which is a qualifier event to get competitors closer to the World's Championship Chili Cook-off held each year in October. The sanctioned event will award the top winners in three categories of chili: Chili Verde, Salsa and traditional Red Chili.

"We are excited to have the event sanctioned by the International Chili Society, which is one of the largest food festival organizations in the world. Cook-offs just like this one have enabled the ICS to raise over a million dollars annually for charity," said museum event coordinator Brenda Minton.

Anyone who thinks that they can cook up the best local bowl of chili is welcomed to enter the People's Choice category, presented by Steve Otto, formerly of the Steve Otto Chili Cook-off in Tampa.

Chefs are only asked to bring at least two gallons of chili in order to provide samples for attendees who will taste the spicy concoctions and submit their votes.

Last year about 1,200 people attended Raising Cane, and Minton suspects that the addition of the chili cook-

off will only help attendance numbers. She is hoping to see around 3,000 people stop by for a sweet or spicy treat.

"Because it's January and, well it's cold everywhere else – unfortunately it's not cold here – but it's in the winter months when you eat chili," Minton said, "and chili cook offs are just popular."

Raising Cane began seven years ago by members of the Southern Syrup Makers, who make syrup from locally grown sugar cane. The Pioneer Museum has a private patch of sugar cane, which locals use to participate in the syrup-tasting event each year at the event. More than 20 syrup makers will offer samples of their products for attendees to taste and vote on, which will begin at 9 a.m. along with the pancake breakfast.

Live entertainment will be provided throughout the day, including performances by The Crackerbillys, the Sara Rose Band & Those Unscrupulous Sunspots, all performing at the Gazebo. The Barking Dogs will perform near the syrup-making mill along with the Solid Gold Barbershop Quartet.

Don't forget to sign up for the iron skillet tossin' and the sugar cane spear tossin' events.

"The last person to throw actually broke the skillet in half. But it was fun, it's just a fun thing," Minton said with a laugh. "It's going to be a nice do to come and hang out, eat some chili and listen to some music."

Admission to the event will be \$5 per person and children 5 and under are free. Parking is free and all proceeds will benefit the museum. The Pioneer Florida Museum & Village is located at 15602 Pioneer Museum Road in Dade City and can be reached by calling (352) 567-0262.

Forest Lake Estates Sold For \$75 Million

The St. Petersburg law firm of Adams and Reese has closed a \$75 million sale of Forest Lake Estates, representing one of the largest transactions of its kind in the Florida manufactured home industry.

The June 2016 sale of the 1,168-lot, 55 + mobile home community in Zephyrhills to a large national real estate investment trust secured a high return on investment for community shareholders who originally banded together to purchase the mobile home park in 1999.


Adams and Reese attorney David S. Bernstein served as legal advisor for the transaction and worked closely

with Brett Schroder, president of Premier Community Management, Realty and Mobile Home Sales, Inc., former management company of the park, to complete the transaction.

"Forest Lake Estates is a historically resident-owned community that, over the years, had experienced the common challenges of shareholder ownership, such as frequent board turnover, disagreements over community management providers, low cash reserve, unfilled vacancies, and an overall clouded long-term vision of the park," Bernstein said. "The ultimate sale of the community garnered a roughly 94% approval rating from shareholders and successfully recognized their equity at a peak of the market."

The sale to the REIT, one of the largest in the U.S., included future provisions to enhance community amenities and services, rent increase caps for 10 years, prepaid rent credits for use toward future rent increases, and a requirement that Forest Lake Estates remain a mobile home park for 20 years. The transaction closed after nearly 8 months of due diligence and negotiations.

Forest Lake Estates' sale marks one of the largest of its kind in Florida history.





City Approves Plan For Wawa But Developer Has Yet To Close On Hercules Property

Zephyrhills has approved the site plan for the Wawa service station and convenience store that could be constructed at the intersection of Gall Boulevard and County Road 54, Todd Vande Berg said on Dec. 23.

The same developer who is planning to purchase part of the former Hercules Park property has also submitted a site plan for a restaurant to be built south of Wawa, the Zephyrhills planning director said.

City Council is likely to address both the Wawa and the restaurant plans in January, Vande Berg said.

Chris Williams, who is in charge of planning for the Pasco County School District, said the developer has not yet purchased the property and the closing on the property was originally scheduled for this month. Williams said the developer has asked for an extension noting that it is a lengthy and involved process. A county operated swimming pool that is located on part of the property was closed a few years ago and has fallen into a state of disrepair. City officials briefly talked about repairing the pool so it could be put back into service but the associated costs appear to be prohibitive.

Zephyrhills is in line to receive a portion of the Hercules Property from the school district after the developer buys the prime parcels that front Gall Boulevard.

The school district is considering making that part of the property available to the city on a long-term lease.

Should the parcel be passed from the school district to Zephyrhills, the city is looking at possibly changing the zoning on part of the property so it can be commercially developed. However, the majority of the property Zephyrhills would receive would be used as a passive park, city officials said.

C1 Bank Changes Hands

The C1 Bank branch at 7435 Gall Blvd., is now operating as a Bank of the Ozarks branch, company officials said recently.

Bank of the Ozarks recently acquired C1 Financial, and its wholly-owned bank subsidiary, C1 Bank, in an all-stock transaction valued at \$402.5 million.

C1 Financial is headquartered in St. Petersburg and operated 31 banking centers and one loan production office at the time of its acquisition by Ozark. C1's banking centers were located on the Gulf Coast and in Miami-Dade and Orange counties.

As of Jan. 1, 2015, C1 was the 18th largest bank headquartered in the state of Florida by assets and the 16th largest by equity, having grown both organically and through acquisition. It was the sixth-fastest growing bank in the United States as measured by asset growth for the five-year period ended June 30, 2014.


