Pioneer Museum Goes West

Overstreet House Used As Film Location

The dirt roads and 19th century buildings at the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village recently provided a cinematic backdrop when a student film crew used the location for their master's thesis project.

A group of about 15 students from Florida State University's College of Motion Picture Arts drove down with box trucks full of equipment for two nights of filming at 15602 Pioneer Museum Road.


The FSU film program is made up of 22 students, who are each specialists in different areas whether it be directing, editing, producing, or writing. The group has spent the past year working on 16 backto-back films, taking turns heading up their own specialization. In the end, each student will have four films to submit as their master's thesis.

The group started the school year developing, pitching and writing different story ideas. This semester they are focusing on shooting, editing and finalizing their projects.

Rika Bhakta, 23, is the only production specialist this year, and was the producer for "The Terrible Trio," the short western filmed at the museum.

"It's about three unlikely people that band together to seek revenge on a notorious outlaw for stealing their possessions," Bhakta summarized.

Students have eight days in production for each film, and when they were planning where to shoot The Terrible Trio, they were specifically looking for a late 1800s or early 1900s cabin to fit the film's genre. **East Pasco Senior News**

"We had found another area for a saloon in Parish, so we were looking for cabins and houses around the area ... We had a night shoot so it was very hard to find a location that would let us film there until two o'clock in the morning," Bhakta said. "We found the museum and it was just perfect. They were very accommodating of our schedule."

The museum had the right look, provided an open space for the students, and its secluded nature allowed the group to take control of the environment. The students shot specifically at the Overstreet House, originally built in the 1860s.

Museum executive director Stephanie Black was amazed at how professional the students were when filming on site.

"They showed up with a couple of box trucks and they were like little ants out there. Everybody knew exactly what they were supposed to be doing – they got it unloaded and set up in a matter of minutes," Black said on April 4. "You wouldn't be able to tell it wasn't a big budget film because they were just so professional and everything was so well done."

The cast and crew worked at the location from about 5:30 p.m. to 2 a.m. on March 27 and 29. The film has wrapped on production and is now in the first round of editing in post-production, Bhakta said.

Black has been invited to the film's eventual screening at FSUs campus in August. A copy of the completed film will also be given to the museum to use as well, Black said.

"It was an incredible experience. It's always nice to have location owners who are welcoming to us ... and encouraging us to follow what we want to do," Bhakta said.

Café 'Boxed In' **On Fifth Avenue**

Entrepreneur Serves Up Homemade Fare Downtown

They may have to rename a block of downtown for Anna Bailey.

The Zephyrhills native's latest Fifth Avenue venture, Creative Souls Café, officially opened March 25 and is adding a colorful and cozy local lunch spot.

The café at 38426 Fifth Ave. is 'sandwiched' between Bailey's other two businesses - Outside The Box and Outside the Box Too.

More than anything, Bailey said she wants to accommodate year-round residents of Zephyrhills.

"I'm not saying I don't want the seasonal people to come and visit, absolutely I do. But I want the city workers, the people who have businesses in our area, the people who are local to come and enjoy this place. This is for them," she said. "We don't have a place that's for us. I want this to be a local place where all the locals can come and hang out."

Located at 38426 Fifth Ave., Creative Souls Café is in its soft opening stage and currently offers customers breakfast and a selection of sandwiches, soups and salads for lunch.

While Bailey said the restaurant business has definitely presented a learning curve, it has been a great experience so far and she is loving it. The location's previous tenants, Stella's and Rose's cafés, left Bailey and her team of supporters with a bit of a fixer upper.

"Just getting everything situated and set up the way it needs to be set up to run smooth, it was nothing when we started so we had to create a kitchen and a system of doing things ... We totally cleaned the entire place," Bailey said.

Her 'Box' shops are a collaborative space offering homemade and antique collections from more than 20 local artists and crafters.

"I'm not doing no more dreams until I get this one going. I need a break," she said, laughing. She opened her first Box shop at the end of August and her second during the Christmas season.

The café is currently operating with a 'soft opening menu' offering select options for breakfast including pancakes, egg sandwiches and homemade biscuits and gravy.

The lunch menu offers soups, salads and sandwiches, with Cubans and Reubens being the most popular so far. The Cuban sandwiches are made with bread from a Cuban bakery in Tampa, baked with a palm frond for the finishing touch, Bailey said.

"It's been a little hectic but it's coming along. Business is coming in and I'm seeing faces and it's great.'

She was originally the chef for the entire operation, but soon realized she needed help in the kitchen and hired a cook. Even so, Bailey still makes the homemade gravy and she and her mom, Carol Wacaser, make the sweet baked goods.

"Today has been so much smoother having another person in the kitchen," Bailey said last Friday.

The menu will continue to be tweaked and eventually add on items without making it too expansive.

"We do want to keep it simple. We didn't put a TV in here because we want this to be a community place where people can come and hang out and chitchat," Bailey said. "It's cool, nobody's sitting on their phones in here. That's awesome and that makes me happy."

Setting up an entertainment schedule for weekend nights is next on Bailey's to do list for the café. An elevated stage was built in front of the store to accommodate live entertainment from local musicians, comedians and to even host karaoke or open mic nights. Bailey plans on obtaining a beer and wine license and to possibly feature special dinner menus for these special nights.

The café is currently open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Sundays are being "tested" to determine whether or not they will be open then.

Her Box shops flanking the café have proved successful, and Bailey is hoping the café will continue to foster growth and foot traffic in the downtown area.

"The stores are doing great. We've had some turnover on vendors ... but we mostly have really positive input," she said. "Between my friends, my family and my husband, you know, yeah it's been insane, but it's also been a total blessing that we've been able to accomplish what we've been able to accomplish since August. We're bringing people downtown and we're proud of that."
