
After weeks, possibly months, of hard work and preparation, homeowners along Church Avenue are finally putting the finishing touches on their holiday decorations.

But, the season is still not over until that last kick at the cat, the New Year's Dance. Those old dancing shoes need unpacking and given a good polish.





The Edwinola Will Live On

Facility Will Be Renovated And Reopened

Birchwood Health Care Properties of Chicago is in the process of purchasing The Edwinola in January with plans to reopen in the spring of 2017, according to Darcielle Gray.

Gray was the administrator of The Edwinola when it closed in September after then-owner American Senior Living of Dade City decided to sell the facility at 14235 Edwinola Way.

Birchwood is a health-care real estate investment firm, which invests in senior housing, nursing homes and specialty health-care real estate.

Approximately \$750,000 in improvements is planned for the building, according to a company press release. They will include upgrading the fire alarm and protection systems and improving the porch and sidewalk to meet Americans with Disabilities Act standards. Also, the walls in the common areas will be repaired and repainted as well as some units. Kitchenettes will be incorporated into some of the independent living units.

The Edwinola operates out of a landmark downtown building that dates back to 1912 when it was constructed as one of the city's first hotels.

"We want to keep the historic and unique look of the building, but we also want to ensure the safety of our residents through strict compliance with all state and federal guidelines," said Sevy Petras, CEO of Priority Life Care, the team that will be managing

The Edwinola.

The Edwinola Retirement Community has 264 rooms that will be used for independent living and assisted living. Two separate floors will be dedicated to Alzheimer's and Dementia care.

The Edwinola will cater to residents by offering amenities such as three meals a day, housekeeping and laundry, as well as daily activities and outings.

"Our community is centered around independence," Petras said. "Residents are able to move into our independent living and enjoy their retirement even as they age and need care."

The Edwinola, which has been a retirement community for more than 30 years, was the subject of a 2015 investigation by the Agency on Healthcare Administration that resulted in a moratorium on the admission of new patients.

Several residents moved out of the Edwinola following the violent deaths of two residents.

An Alzheimer's patient fatally beat another Alzheimer's patient there on April 13, 2015.

Also, a 55-year-old woman died on April 21, 2015, after she jumped or fell from a second floor balcony. She lived in a secure area of The Edwinola but she was permitted to go on the balcony because it was a common area where residents could smoke.

The state also received reports of instances where several patients had wandered out of the facility's "lock down" unit. Dade City police found some patients at various places including nearby highways. The Edwinola's staff was reportedly not aware of the absence of these patients until police notified them.


When Lynn Hickman and her husband, Steve, moved on to Church

Avenue five years ago, they were promptly told of the goings on during the holidays. Lynn was no stranger to the prospect, as there was a similar event in her hometown in North Carolina.

"Christmas is my favorite time of the year so we love Church Street Christmas," Hickman said. "I think Christmas is a time to shower our neighbors and friends and family and it just plays right in to how we feel about Christmas."

Hickman said she has been planning and decorating for more than a month, buying multiple Christmas trees and tediously placing the strings of lights on her house. Hickman's is one of several homes on the street that are more than 100 years old, and represent a historical aspect of Dade City that is nice to pay tribute to at Christmas, she said. Participation is not required of homeowners, but almost everyone does without fail come December.

"It's a lot of work, but it's worth it... it's a labor of love," Hickman said. "If it weren't for the residents on the street, if they didn't participate, there wouldn't be a Church Street Christmas."

Richland Recreates Christmas Tale



Defeat Holiday Stress

Repair Fractured Family Gatherings



Tips For The Head **And Heart**

The holiday season can leave people feeling like the Grinch who stole Christmas before his heart grew three sizes. The hustle, the bustle, the search for the "just right" present can cause holiday stress. A contentious election season also has left people fearful of family gatherings turning into dustups.

Dr. Carletta Perry, assistant professor of psychology at Saint Leo University, offered some hints for dealing with holiday stress.

The joy of the holiday is in the spirit of how we prepare and celebrate, she said. Rather than scrambling for the perfect gift or busting a budget, "know that love and time are the most valuable gifts you can give," Perry said.

And don't overdo it.

"Starting with yourself, love you

enough to value your time," the Saint Leo psychologist said. "Let others help you and value what others can offer. They will feel valued, and you won't be left feeling exhausted and resentful."

Family is often the origin of our pain but it is also the origin of healing. "Don't miss out on spending time with the ones you love," Perry said. "Be thankful for the ones who are present and honor those who are no longer present."

She offered some practical advice for those family events: Show up with a positive attitude and a plan. "For example, take an old video to show, share pictures, or look up relatives and friends on Facebook to share in their experiences."

Rather than being Grinch-like and hoping the Christmas season (and Hanukkah) were over already, "get in the spirit by enjoying every 'to do' item, planning for the special day, or cooking a special dish," Perry advised. "Celebrate by being a part of the wonderful time of the


