

Can Boys Repeat Success Of Last Year's Run?

The Nature Coast Holiday Classic was a measuring stick for the Class 5A-District 8 leading Bulldogs.

Taking on some of the toughest teams on the hardwood, the Bulldogs suffered back-to-back losses before capping off the tournament with a win to start the second half of the season at 10-3 overall, 9-1 in district play.

The Bulldogs are in familiar territory as the New Year begins. Last season, prior to the state Final Four run, Zephyrhills was 10-3 as the second half of the season started. Then the Bulldogs won 11 of 12 regular season games, three district tournament games and three regional games before falling in the state

Zephyrhills opened last week's Nature Coast tournament with a 71-60 loss to Shaker Heights of Ohio. Turnovers in the first quarter resulted in easy layups for the Red Raiders. As a result, the Bulldogs fell behind 16-2 in the opening quarter and tried to battle back the rest of the game. Senior center Kurt Robbins led the Bulldogs with 24 points.

In the second round of the consolation bracket, the Bulldogs had the opportunity to take down Tampa Gaither. Holding a slight lead in the fourth quarter, the Bulldogs watched Robbins go down with an ankle

injury. When time expired, Zephyrhills fell 60-55. Robbins finished with 16 points.

The Bulldogs took the final consolation game 56-49 against Friendship Collegiate Academy of Washington, D.C., to end the tournament on a positive note. Stepping up for the Bulldogs were Dre'wan Clark and Aliza Quiles.

"All three of those games we could have won," said Zephyrhills head coach Mike Novak. "That tournament was good for us to see smart, fast and well-coached teams. We learned [that] we need to make stops and play better defense."

2017 Focus Will Be Obamacare, Veterans, FDA

Looking back on 2016, a turbulent year for sure in politics, we often saw the biggest rivalries and the loudest pundits take center stage.

All along, my main focus was always working hard on behalf of Florida's 12th District. We accomplished some important legislative wins for our communities, with 16 initiatives that I wrote being signed into law this year.

Making sure veterans have a robust support system for returning home would help with a whole host of problems like homelessness, unemployment, and substance abuse. I will be making this a priority in the coming year.

After three years of work, the 21st Century Cures Act finally crossed the finish line in December. This legislation is a game-changer for millions of patients and families who are affected by diseases like cancer, Alzheimer's, ALS, and more. Importantly, Cures includes my initiatives to create a national database for neurological diseases

and streamline FDA regulations to get medical products to market faster.

researchers, and advocates about how government can become an ally – not an obstruction – to medical innovation. Proudly, much of their input is now reflected in the final law.

Additionally, we passed legislation to help seniors better identify out-of-pocket costs under Medicare, and combat the opioid abuse crisis across the nation.

While this work does not always dominate national headlines, it can truly improve lives and make a difference in our communities.

In 2017, I plan to hit the ground running to continue these efforts.

At the top of the agenda is repealing and replacing Obamacare.

Under Obamacare, costs have nearly doubled for working families, millions of people have been kicked off the insurance plans they like, and insurers have fled the market, leaving people with less options for their health care. Our health care system should be affordable, personalized, and offer the best quality care possible.

We also need to overhaul the tax code, and ensure it is focused on maximizing growth and competitiveness for American businesses. The tax code should make it easier for businesses to create jobs and raise wages, not harder. Our system should be simpler and fairer for hardworking families, too.

None of the successes of the past year, or the goals set for the year ahead, would be possible without the folks of Florida's 12th District. Your voices will continue to guide me as your representative in the United States House of Representatives.


