Varsity Squad Struggles On Defense

Pasco's Tyler Dueker scored a hat trick Tuesday night to help power the Pirates to an 8-0 victory against Zephyrhills.

It was the second 8-0 rout of Zephyrhills (1-13) this season for coach Barry Graying's Pirates (11-2-1). The Pirates have not lost to Zephyrhills in 13 years.

With a 2-0 lead, thanks to goals by Julian Padilla and Alexandro Dele-Torro Montes, Dueker rattled off three

consecutive goals in a seven-minute span. The Pirates ended the half with a 6-0 lead with Saul Arellano-Rodriguez adding the sixth score.

The second half opened with another goal by Padilla to extend the lead to 7-0. Miguel Flores ended the game with the eighth goal, triggering a mercy rule to end the game.

This was the first game for both teams since before the Christmas break.

The Pasco Pirates enjoyed their Senior Night on Tuesday, defeating a stubborn Zephyrhills squad, 7-3, as the teams played out the 9-Mile War on the soccer pitch.

The Bulldogs (2-17) kept pace with the Pirates (14-1-1) for the entire first half, as Pasco appeared as if they were going through the motions.

Pasco controlled the game early by scoring two goals, but Zephyrhills answered as Jaydean Ireland scored three goals in the final 13 minutes of the first half to complete her hat trick. Ireland has scored the last four goals the Bulldogs have recorded against the Pirates.

The second half looked a little more promising for

the Pirates as they dominated play for most of the time. Jennifer Luna connected with her second goal of the night and junior Jordyn Kadlub, the sixth-highest scorer in the nation, rattled off three consecutive goals in a ten-minute span.

The game had plenty of errors and missed opportunities for the Pirates, as they were not able to make simple shots, including a few point-blank range shots and a few shots that hit the crossbar. Kadlub had some difficulties on offense in the first half but returned to form with her hat-trick blitz. Bulldog goalie Hope Johnson stymied the Pirates with some strong saves throughout the game.





Pregnancy Center Resets 5K

Organizers Hope Delay Won't Hamper Event

Despite a month delay, the Pregnancy Care Center of Zephyrhills is still hosting their almost-annual Run for Life 5K at the end of this month.

Because of scheduling conflicts for organizer Roberta Vincent, the December date was not available so the center scheduled the event to take place Jan. 27 in downtown Zephyrhills.

The race begins on Fifth Avenue at the downtown Time Square stage. The 5K run will start at 8:30 a.m. with the one-mile walk/run to follow shortly after at 9 a.m.

The route will zigzag through various streets of Zephyrhills, eventually ending where it started.

There will be two water stations on the course route, and refreshments will be available afterward for participants. Awards for top finishers overall and in age group categories will follow the events, and drawings for prize giveaways will also take place.

Cost is currently \$25 for the 5K and \$15 for the mile race and registration is available on the day of the race, although prices may increase slightly.

There will be no raffles this year and no grants were presented to the center, so all money raised will come from registration costs and go to the pregnancy center. In years past the run has attracted anywhere from 70 to more than 100 participants.

"I'm hoping a lot of people will come. [The Pregnancy Care Center] helps hundreds of women and children in desperate situations. It's a really necessary nonprofit and I hope people realize that and realize there's something good going on," Vincent said.

The fifth installment of the run will feature free giveaways donated from local businesses and music provided by DJ Quinn Blalock.

Vincent encourages all, whether they run, walk or even just watch, to attend and support the pregnancy center.

"It provides a fun and healthy event for people of all ages to participate in, and makes the work of the center visible of those who need their help and services," she said. "It's for a good cause and they can test their athletic prowess if they want or they can just go out and have fun with their friends."
