# **Bulldogs Suddenly Struggling**

Coach Likely To Shake Up Lineup For Some Punch

Rusty Guynn is a baseball coach who is never content. In fact, the Zephyrhills High skipper is worried.

Most coaches would be pleased with a 6-2 record this season, but not Guynn. He watched his team drop a pair of games after a 6-0 start and just shakes his head.

"We are in a very tough part of our schedule," Guynn said following Thursday's 8-3 home loss to Bishop McLaughlin. "These next three weeks coming up are big. We could lose seven in a row. They don't care. They are just glad to be here. This is what happens


when you're just glad to be here."

The Bulldogs are currently playing in the Spring Break Farm Bureau Classic Tournament at Hernando High School, but when they return, the schedule will be a huge test.

Guynn will use the tournament to evaluate players and possibly make changes when the Bulldogs hit the heart of the district schedule.

"This gives me three or four games to look at everybody and change the lineup around," Guynn said. "We need to see what works for us. I need to find



Waldron made a fabulous shot to win the third game of the championship match. He was in the kitchen, 10 off, and the opponent had two eights and Waldron didn't quite have room to score. Against Bishop McLaughlin, the Bulldogs struck out seven times while scattering eight hits. Trey Owens led the Bulldogs at the plate going 3-for-4 scoring twice.

The Hurricanes collected seven of their runs from three home runs hit off of Bulldog pitching. Junior Tyreese Wigfall gave up a solo homer and a three-run blast, and junior Ricky Dunn gave up a three-run shot.

Four of the runs were unearned.

"Then we're looking at a 4-3 ballgame," Guynn said. "We have to be better."

### Baseball Team Takes Its Lumps In Stride

When Ethan Keys took his position at second base for Zephyrhills Christian Academy against Cypress Creek, he looked like he would have been more comfortable playing on a Little League field instead of a varsity diamond against Cypress Creek.

Keys is one of two ZCA varsity starters who are just 12-years-old on a team with only four players who are high school age. Ithan Pujols, who is listed on the roster at 4-foot-10 and 90 pounds, is the other sixth grader on the squad.

ZCA's baseball program is in its third season. In the first two seasons, the

Warriors played against opposing junior varsity teams. This year, they are playing against varsity competition.

Despite the Warriors 15-0 loss to firstyear team Cypress Creek, head coach Jason Fladd makes sure his young squad leaves the field with their head held high. So far, ZCA has been outscored 111-15.

"It's tough. I have 10 kids and two of them are 12 years old," Fladd said. "These real young kids are going to get better. They are going to have seven years of varsity experience."

ZCA's program started from scratch and Fladd looks at the football and basketball teams as motivation as to what the future can hold for his Warriors.

"It's a lot of work. We're trying to be build these men up," Fladd said. "What happens with a lot of these small Christian programs [is that] kids start coming. Our football and basketball programs started out that way. We help these guys get better every day."




