\$200,000 Purse Makes For Quite The Lure

When Austin Schroeder was just 3-years-old, he reeled in a three-pound large-mouth bass out of a pond off of State Road 54. The moment the fight was over and the smile swept over his face, he was hooked.

Fast-forward 17 years, this 2015 Zephyrhills High School grad is one of the top fishermen in the state and possibly the country. He will prove his skill next week against seasoned pros in the Ray Scott National Championship at

Old Hickory Lake, in Nashville, Tenn.

That passion for fishing came the day he and his father Chad cast lines into that pond close to their Zephyrhills home.

"Dad got me in and that started the fire," said the younger Schroeder, who started tournament fishing with his dad at the age of nine. "We finished fifth out of 250 boats. Since then, I knew what I wanted to do."

This will not be his first shot at a Ray Scott championship as he has qualified

Bulldog's First Unstoppable

Weightlifters Prove Strong In Regionals

Zephyrhills 119-pound weightlifter John First went on a journey of faith in his quest for a Class 1A Region title.

A shoulder injury put him in a position where he was questioning whether he could win his weight class and represent the Bulldogs in the FHSAA Class 1A state championships.

At Saturday's regional meet at Belleview, First, a junior, had a strategy to put his emphasis on his bench press to carry him through a clean and jerk lift that he expected to be sub-par.

Instead, still nursing the injury, First had a 185-pound bench press that was below his expectations. He had to dig deep to redeem himself with a clean and jerk that would push him to the title.

His 170-pound lift put him in a tie with Gulf's Antrevis Hardy with a 355-pound total.

First's faith and perseverance was rewarded with the title as he started the meet weighing in at 117.4 pounds while Hardy tipped the scales at 118.8 pounds.

"It's a blessing," First said. "With

Registration Open For Women's Volleyball Summer Camps

The Saint Leo University volleyball program and head Coach Sam Cibrone have announced the 2017 summer camp schedule that features a high school camp, a position camp and a middle school camp.

All three camps are available as both day camps and overnight camps for female athletes and will all take place at the Marion Bowman Activities Center.

The first camp will be the Saint Leo High School volleyball camp for female athletes from the age of 14 through 18 from July 24-26. The camp is geared toward players looking to maximize their volleyball potential. Cost is \$200 for the day camp and \$300 for the overnight camp.

The second will be the Saint Leo Position Camp for ages 10-18 on July 26 and 27. The position volleyball camp is designed for players who have the desire to improve their position specific skills. Each camper will be taken through step-by-step progressions, which will include basic fundamentals. Each position will

focus on their appropriate footwork, hand positions and arm swing mechanics. Setters will be trained in advanced concepts that will include setting various quick sets and running an offense. Attackers will be trained in advanced positional attacking. Liberos will focus on footwork, platform angles, and proper posture. Cost is \$125 for the day camp and \$175 for the overnight camp.

The third camp will be the Saint Leo Middle School camp from July 27-29. This camp will be for athletes' ages 10 through 13 and is designed to teach fundamental skills of volleyball. Campers will be grouped based on age and skill level and will be introduced to serving, passing, setting, attacking, blocking and defense. everything I went through with the shoulder injury, it was worth it. I had to rehab the shoulder. I couldn't do a clean and jerk for two weeks."

He learned from his experience at the regional meet and he will apply that lesson to his quest for a state title.

"It was all a mindset," First said. "It wasn't about being physical to lift, it was spiritual. You have to believe in yourself to be able to win."

"Obstacles just make you stronger. There was a lot piling up and in the long run, I overcame it and became regional champ."

First is not representing Zephyrhills alone. The winner of each weight class gains an automatic berth to the state meet, but the state also adds 12 at-large berths based on their respective regional performances.


Fellow Bulldog 119-pounder Kenten Emerson advanced after his third place lift of 160 pounds on bench and 165 pounds on clean and jerk.

for the event every year since he was 15 years old. His best finish was seventh during his first shot at the tournament when he brought home \$4,000 and wrapped up the season reeling in about \$25,000.

"Ever since high school, I've been trying to build it up and get better," Schroeder said.

Schroeder can boast that he has reeled in a fish weighing 9 pounds, 15 ounces. Actually, he has done it three times. He is still in search of that first fish to tip the scales at 10 pounds.

Schroeder recently finished fifth in the American Bass Anglers Ram Truck Open Series Florida South at Lake Okeechobee where he is the 2017 points leader.

Like any sponsored competitor, Schroeder thanks his sponsors ARK rods, True South custom lures, Ardent reels, and his supporters.

Schroeder will hit the road Saturday for Music City with an eye on a big chunk of the \$200,000 purse.

"It's huge," said Schroeder, who plans to be a well-sponsored full-time tournament fisherman. "I win that, it will change my life."

Dick Jarrett Lauded At Memorial Service

Mourners packed the chapel of Hodges Family Funeral Home to capacity on March 20 to pay their last respects to William Richard "Dick" Jarrett Sr.

"Mr. Jarrett", as he was known by so many, passed away peacefully at home on March 16 with his wife, Barbara, holding his hand. He was 88.

Jarrett was a businessman and philanthropist and owned Jarrett Ford for 38 years before selling his shares in the dealership to his sons and business partner Cliff Martin.

In 2004, Dade City designated part of the road that is in front of the dealership as Dick Jarrett Way in recognition of his contributions to the community.

The Rev. Randall Belcher officiated at the memorial service.

"People like Mr. Jarrett make you proud to live where you live. He touched a lot of lives. It was kind of a ripple effect," Belcher said.

One of Jarrett's sons, Brian Jarrett, said he didn't know how many lives his father had touched in Dade City.

"Dad loved Dade City," Brian said.

His father was born on a farm in Rockingham County, N.C., on Jan. 12, 1929 – just 8 ½ months old before the stock market crash that ushered in the Great Depression.

"He grew up following the southbound end of a northbound mule," Brian said. "There wasn't anything that my father couldn't do." Dick Jarrett drove a school bus at age 14, a logging truck when he was 15, and joined the U.S. Navy when he was 17.

Brian noted that his father became a foreman over sailors who painted the ship he was on while he was in the Navy. He used that "experience" to land a job as a painter at a body shop when the family moved to Clearwater several years later.

"He had never painted an automobile in his life," Brian said, adding that wasn't the first time his father used "alternative facts" to further his career.

Dick Jarrett once flew an airplane under the Sunshine Skyway Bridge while "dogfighting" with a World War II Navy pilot, Brian said. The men who were painting the bridge reported them and his dad and the other pilot were admonished once they landed their planes.

Jarrett also used to put Buick engines in Model A Fords and race them on Florida's A1A highway, Brian said.

But his dad's greatest adventure began in 1978 when he sold everything, put together \$50,000, and used it as a down payment to start Jarrett Ford Motor Company in Dade City.

"He always wanted a hometown," Brian said, because his father had moved

around a great deal when he was younger searching for work.

"He fell in love with Dade City and Dade City fell in love with him," Brian said.

Jarrett supported several charitable efforts in Dade City and the surrounding area and attended numerous hog and steer sales at both the Pasco County Fair and the Florida State Fair.

Martin shared the story of how he had been invited by Dick and Barbara Jarrett to go to the Pasco County Fair with them in 2004. After being softened up with a delicious steak dinner, Martin accompanied the Jarretts into a barn where a steer auction was being held. Bidding was going at 2.5 then 3 then 4, Martin said. He thought people were paying \$400 for the steer.

"Dick leaned over to me and asked if I thought it was okay to bid 10, and I said okay," Martin said. After the auction was over, Martin had to collect the steer that had sold for more than \$11,000. It was then he realized, Martin said, that the bids were for dollar-per-pound increments and that the steer weighed more than 1,100 pounds.

"Dick told me it didn't cost him a nickel because he had three partners to pay for it. It took me three years to recover," Martin said.

"He told me that if you take care of your community, your community will take

care of you," Brian said.

"Everyone was a friend of Dick Jarrett. As a matter of fact, that became quite a joke around the dealership. People were coming in all the time and saying they were a friend of Dick Jarrett's," Brian said.

Jarrett provided food that local high school students ate each year on Principal's Day. Pat Reedy recounted an incident that occurred while he was principal at Pasco Middle School.

Reedy said he had told the students to not have too much to eat. "Then Dick Jarrett comes in and he told the children 'to order more than they could eat and to eat the ice cream first,'" said Reedy, who later became principal of Pasco High School.

"I knew him for many years through Rotary," Bob Hatfield, a retired educator, said of Jarrett. "He reached out to the community in so many ways behind the scenes without any fanfare," said Hatfield, who now works for U.S. Rep. Gus Bilirakis, R-FL (12).

Rev. Belcher said Jarrett "made a rather strong impact on the people he met."

Jarrett was well known for his generosity, Belcher said. He operated Jarrett Ford Motor Company in a Christian manner and gave back a portion of what he had received. That trait has been passed down to his sons and other business partners, so he will have a lasting legacy, Belcher said.

Pet Crematorium Offers Compassionate Service

Faithful Friends Understands How Deep The Loss Of A Pet Can Be

Faithful Friends Pet Cremation will soon begin its second decade of service and is preparing for the future. Carolyn Hodges and her daughter, Rachel LeBlanc,

own the business and Rachel's husband, Damon LeBlanc, is a certified crematory operator.

Faithful Friends recently purchased a new, five-chamber, machine to use for pet cremations. The state-of-the-art machine is designed to cremate pets that range from a few pounds to more than 150 pounds.

"There is no co-mingling whatsoever of the ashes of pets that are cremated in that machine," Damon LeBlanc said.

Faithful Friends also has its large retort, as the machines are called. That retort is used when multiple cremations are being performed and the pets' owners do not want the ashes returned to them.

The family owned business on Eighth Street opened in July of 2007 and provides services throughout central Florida.

The business also has a contract for the cremation of pets that have been euthanized at the Pasco County Animal Services shelter but that service has lessened since the shelter became a no-kill operation. Close to 90 percent of the pets at the shelter are either returned to their owners or are adopted by new owners.

A staff member from Faithful Friends is always available – 24 hours a day, 365 days a year – to come to a person's home or to a veterinarian's office to pick up a pet's remains. There is no extra charge for picking up pet remains at night, during the weekend or on holidays.

"The family can't control when their pet passes away," Damon LeBlanc said.

"Part of our job is grief counseling. We try to help them get through it" Hodges said. "We also work with Gulfside Regional Hospice's Pet Loss Support Group that is held the last Thursday of the month at the Hospice Care Center on Dean Dairy Road," she said.

A pet's remains are kept in a cooler until they are cremated, Hodges said. Normally, the pet's owner has already made arrangements regarding the type of urn or container in which the ashes will be placed.

Faithful Friends offers a variety of urns its customers may choose from. The ashes are always placed in a decorated bag before they are put into the container.

The average turnaround is two business days from the time Faithful Friends receives a pet's remains until the ashes are returned to the animal's owner, Hodges said.

Some customers even want to watch as the cremation is performed, Damon LeBlanc said. He sits with them and tells them in advance what is going to occur during the cremation process.

"Some families have come to us because they took their pet's remains somewhere else and were told they couldn't watch," Hodges said.

No family who has asked for Faithful Friends' services has ever been turned away, Hodges said. Staff members have driven as far as The Villages to the north and Clearwater to the south to pick up pets' remains, she explained.


