Expect The Unexpected

'Bump in the Road' Presentation Well-Received

When someone is faced with an unexpected change, they are often uncertain of how to handle it. Thankfully, best-selling author Mary Jane Cronin has all the answers.

Cronin paid a visit Tuesday to American House, a Zephyrhills assisted living facility, to impart her wisdom to its residents and staff.

Cronin's hour-long presentation of Bumps in the Road expounded on the positive ways one can overcome a difficult life change, such as retirement, illness or loss. She was inspired to write about such matters after the sudden loss of her son. "I was devastated. He was sixteen years old," Cronin said. "I was afraid, I was panicking. As a result, I sat and wrote letters to heaven ... and through my writings, my first book came out."

Cronin has been writing since early 2000 and has produced four books. All of the wisdom she imparts in her books comes from personal experience. The loss of her son and her work as a counselor at hospice for ten years were the basis for her first two books.

Her latest book, "Unexpected Change," has become a best seller on Amazon and provided the basis for her lecture at

Tractor Collection Keeps Man Busy

81-Year-Old Plows Ahead With Hobby

Tractors have been a part of Dale Forrester's life for as long as he can remember.

Forrester, 81, of Zephyrhills, grew up near Lowville, N.Y. The city nestled near the Adirondack Mountains was never a big place and it still has less than 6,000 residents.

Forrester was a dairy farmer in Lowville for many years and his interest in antique tractors began after a friend of his gave him some magazines about them.

He dropped out of school after finishing the eighth grade because he said classes were boring and he wanted to spend his time doing something else.

Looking back now, Forrester said he probably would have stayed in school if vocational training, or shop classes as they are sometimes called, had been available then.

More than 40 years ago he bought a 1948 McCormick Farmall H and used it on his farm. He brought it with him when he moved to Zephyrhills in 1998.

That tractor is still in tip-top condition and he used it to tow a float in the 2011 Founders' Day parade and it has made several parade appearances since then.

Most recently, he exhibited the tractor at the Touch A Truck event held at the Zephyrhills Public Library.

Forrester began collecting other tractors in 2010 when he retired after having worked as a janitor for 12 years at the First United Methodist Church in Zephyrhills.

He now attends the First Baptist Church in Zephyrhills but is still a member of the

Methodist men's group and says he really loves The Lord. "I wouldn't be here if it weren't for him," Forrester said.

His collection has grown to include a 1960 International Cadet, a 1948 McCormick-Deering Farmall Cub, a 1941 Farmall M and a 1952 Primeall Super A Industrial. He also owned a 1950 Farmall

Motor Vehicle Services Suspended This Weekend



The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles is scheduled to migrate its current enterprise database infrastructure into a cloud solution next week. During the migration, all driver license and motor vehicle services will be unavailable to customers and stakeholders throughout the weekend.

Services will become unavailable starting at 7 p.m. on Friday and are scheduled to be restored by 8 a.m. on June 19.

The database migration will affect all driver license and motor vehicle offices statewide as well as all online services. Affected services include: driver license and ID card issuance and renewals, driver license testing, address updates, vehicle titling and registrations, vehicle information checks, commercial driver license services, vessel titling and registrations, parking permits, electronic lien services and other department services.

Customers who need any of the services listed are urged to plan in advance for the database migration. All law enforcement related systems will remain operational throughout the weekend.

C tractor, but sold it to a 92-year-old World War II veteran of the Battle of the Bulge. "He's the only person I would have sold it to and he really enjoys it," Forrester said.

And Forrester is still eager to add more tractors to his collection.

He has found most of his tractors by scanning ads on Craigslist. He has called a couple of people two or three years after they originally listed their tractors and they still had them, Forrester said.

Two of the tractors he bought were in Zephyrhills, one was in Hudson and another one was in Gainesville. Forrester said he calls people and gets information before hitching up his neighbor's trailer to his own pickup truck and hitting the road.

"I usually know I am going to buy a tractor when I take off. It costs a lot of money just to tow that trailer," Forrester said.

He always gets good deals on the tractors he buys because most of them need some work done on them.

"I overhauled my first engine when I was 80," he said with a chuckle.

He replaced the engine in another one of the tractors he bought and has had to replace the tires on most of the tractors he has acquired.

He even sandblasted one of his tractors and repainted it, but now has someone else handle the sandblasting.

"I'm getting too old to do that," he said.

Forrester currently subscribes to six magazines about tractors and was even featured in an issue of Red Power magazine earlier this year. His wife, Joy, wrote the article and sent some photographs and Red Power published it in recognition of Forrester's 80th birthday and of his keen interest in collecting tractors.

"It doesn't take a rocket scientist to fix them," he said. "They are simple to work on. It gives me something to do. It keeps my mind active."

American House.

Residents listened intently as she listed off different ways to deal with the grief that often follows a change. Cronin recommended such actions as early planning, assembling a support system, journaling, breathing exercises, and, most importantly, laughter. She also took her audience step by step through a meditative process designed to alleviate stress.

"When I Left hospice and went into private practice and started these presentations, I was originally

focusing on caregiver needs," said Cronin. "My goal was to invite family members of the residents to come and learn skills on how to take care of themselves."

Cronin's audience at American House was very receptive. At the end of her presentation, she gave a copy of her latest book to each resident who attended, hoping they will continue to utilize her wisdom on a regular basis and share what they learned with others.

"I would say not to sweat the small

stuff but, the thing is, when you're going through a bump in the road, it's not the small stuff," Cronin said.

"I think the important thing is to know that you can overcome it. You just have to take a deep breath, look at your options, and work toward getting over that bump."




